WHAT ARE THE GREEN APPLE AWARDS?

The Green Apple Environment Awards were established in 1994 as an annual campaign to recognise, reward and promote environmental best practice around the world.

They are **FREE TO ENTER** and open to anyone who is helping the environment.

The Green Apple Awards was one of the first campaigns to be accepted as an RSA-accredited feeder scheme into the European Business Awards for the Environment, so Green Apple Award winners are automatically considered to represent their country in the Brussels-led EBAs.

There are still only a few UK schemes that have this honour.

WHO CAN ENTER?

Anyone who is making a positive impact on the built environment, or helping to preserve our architectural heritage. Previous winners include most of the well-known building companies; large and small contractors and architects; councils; building materials manufacturers and suppliers; etc., etc - right down to individual thatchers, stonemasons and other trades people who are keeping traditional skills and crafts alive.

HOW TO ENTER

Simply complete the two-page entry form, and answer the 20 questions.

IF POSSIBLE, please also send a digital version together with your paper entry. You can also enclose before-and-after photographic prints of the project.

HOW MANY ENTRIES CAN I SUBMIT?

No overall limit, but no more than two in any one category.

TIMETABLE

- ◆ Entries close February 28
- ◆ Acknowledgements sent within 10 days of receipt
- ◆ Judging in March
- ◆ Notification by April 10
- ◆ Presentation ceremony in June at the Tower of London.

WHAT YOU CAN WIN

We will be presenting Gold, Silver and Bronze trophies in each category and the highest scorers will be announced as Green Champions.

Winners will be given free £110 tickets for the prizegiving ceremony and presented with a personalised Green Apple trophy. You will also be given a draft press release to publicise your success, and free use of the Green Apple Winner logo.

Just Google 'Green Apple Environment Awards' to see the acres of media coverage devoted to our winners.

You will probably also see yourself on television as we are currently negotiating to have the whole winners ceremony filmed and broadcast.

You will have the chance to represent your country in the European Business Awards for the Environment, and the highest overall scorer will win a free holiday - a week for two in AquaCity, Slovakia, voted the world's greenest resort in the World Travel Awards.

You will also have the opportunity to become a National Green Hero.

We present National Green Hero wall shields at the House of Commons, and they are awarded to winners who 'help others to help the environment'.

eg: Value to the community

3: FINANCIAL BENEFIT

4: VISUAL IMPACT

5: ENERGY EFFICIENCY

eg: Incorporating water harvesting, renewable energy.

6: WASTES MINIMISATION

eg: Reducing landfill and lorry miles.

7: RECYCLED MATERIALS

eg: Re-using component parts.

8: ARCHITECTURAL HERITAGE

eg: Preserving the best of our past, and designing in character with existing buildings.

9: TRADITIONAL CRAFTS AND SKILLS

eg: Thatching, stonemasons and other specialist work

10: MINIMAL ENVIRONMENTAL DISRUPTION

11: INNOVATION

12: TRANSFERABILITY

eg: Can others benefit by adopting the techniques used in completing this project?

Entries are invited, even if you cannot 'tick all of the boxes' as we are keen to learn about environmental endeavours on all levels. For your guidance, The Green Apple Awards adopt the Bruntland Report definition of 'sustainable development' – "That it meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs."
